RED FLAG WATCH (SOMETHING THAT MIGHT HAPPEN)

DISCUSSION: ZONAL FLOW ACROSS DISTRICT WITH LOW AMPLITUDE HIGH PRESSURE RIDGE KEEPING STRONG ENOUGH WINDS ALOFT TO PRODUCE WINDY CONDITIONS FRIDAY BECAUSE OF ADDITIONAL HEATING AT THE SURFACE. VERY LOW DEW POINT AGAIN FRIDAY AFTERNOON COUPLED WITH THE WIND JUSTIFIES RED FLAG WATCH.

There are grizzly bears in this country. Please do not leave garbage on line.

Keep all dog zones clear unless using retardant or water drops.

Stay alert for increased fire activity with strong winds.

Let's make sure we all review the 10 standard firefighting rules and the situations that shout watch out.

STANDARD

- I INITIATE ALL ACTION BASED ON CURRENT AND EXPECTED FIRE BEHAVIOR.
- R RECOGNIZE CURRENT WEATHER CONDITIONS AND OBTAIN FORECASTS.
- E ENSURE INSTRUCTIONS ARE GIVEN AND UNDERSTOOD.
- O OBTAIN CURRENT INFORMATION ON FIRE STATUS.
- R REMAIN IN COMMUNICATION WITH CREW MEMBERS, YOUR SUPERVISOR, AND ADJOINING FORCES.
- D DETERMINE SAFETY ZONES AND ESCAPE ROUTES.
- E ESTABLISH LOOKOUTS IN POTENTIALLY HAZARDOUS SITUATIONS.
- R RETAIN CONTROL AT ALL TIMES.
- S STAY ALERT, KEEP CALM, THINK CLEARLY, ACT DECISIVELY.

FIRE SITUATIONS THAT SHOUT "WATCH OUT"

2. IN COUNTRY NOT SEEN IN DAYLIGHT.

4. UNFAMILIAR WITH WEATHER AND LOCAL FACTORS INFLUENCING FIRE BEHAVIOR.
5. UNINFORMED ON STRATEGY, TACTICS, AND HAZARDS.
6. INSTRUCTIONS AND ASSIGNMENTS NOT CLEAR.
7. NO COMMUNICATION LINK WITH CREW MEMBERS OR SUPERVISOR.
8. CONSTRUCTING LINE WITHOUT A SAFE ANCHOR POINT.
9. BUILDING FIRELINE DOWNHILL WITH FIRE BELOW.
10. ATTEMPTING FRONTAL ASSAULT ON FIRE.
11. UNBURNED FUEL BETWEEN YOU AND FIRE.
12. CANNOT SEE MAIN FIRE, NOT IN CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO CAN.
13. ON A HILLSIDE WHERE ROLLING MATERIAL CAN IGNITE FUEL BELOW.
14. WEATHER BECOMING HOTTER AND DRIER.
15. WIND INCREASES AND/OR CHANGES DIRECTION.

safety tip



When in grizzly country:

- Be on the lookout for bears. Do not approach them too closely. Do not get between a sow and her cubs.
- Make noise while moving to avoid startling a bear.
- Avoid wearing or carrying bright colors. These apparently convince grizzlies you are carrying food.
- Select a campsite near good climbing trees. Pitch your tent at least 125 feet upwind from your cooking area and your food and garbage. Keep campsite clean. Keep pots and pans clean and free of food odors. Seal all food and garbage in plastic bags and suspend in trees by ropes at least 15 feet off ground.

Women should avoid traveling into grizzly country during their menstrual period.

If you encounter a grizzly:

- Don't panic.
- If the bear doesn't charge or menace you, speak to it in firm, even tones and back away slowly.
- Never run. Climb high into a tree if possible.
- If the bear charges, shout (don't scream) at it.
- If you are attacked, try to lie face down on the ground or curl up with hands clasped behind your neck. Play dead. Don't struggle or cry out.
- Don't attempt to fight, wrestle, or even physically restrain the bear.
