Narrative: 09/26/2011 at Approximately 13:00 AST Coastal AStar 350BA N230CH with Helicopter Manager and Pilot on board had landed on Davies Creek Ridge. The pilot rolled the throttle to flight idle to start the 2 minute cool down and a strong gust of wind picked the helicopter up and laid it on it's side. The helicopter manager said she felt movement, looked out to discover the helicopter was lifting into the air about 5 feet and started to roll. The helicopter hit on it's side, the pilot shut down the helicpter and both exited the helicpter to discover fuel spewing from the helicopter. Both claimed to be ok to the two PNW workers who were on site, waiting to be picked up. The Helicopter manager phoned dispatch/Forest Aviation Officer and reported the incident. A helicopter was dispatched to retrieve the pilot/crew due to the remoteness of the site. They were all then transported back to Juneau and the pilot/helicopter manager was seen by a physician at the Bartlett Hospital Emergency room and treated then released.

The R6/R10 Aviation Manager was notified and he notified the National Aviation Safety Manager who is putting together an Accident Investigation Team, expected to be on site in Juneau by 09/27/2011 at approximately 14:00 AST.
